


# HEADFORT SCHOOL

#### **INTRODUCTION TO HEADFORT**

Headfort School sets itself apart in its liberal approach to education with small classes and subject-specialist teachers. A co-educational and non-denominational school, it offers outstanding, all-round primary education for both day and boarding pupils where sport and extra-curricular activities form an integral part of each school day.



Headfort is set among 60 acres of stunning grounds and is less than an hour from Dublin. The school boosts the unique backdrop of a Robert Adam's Ballroom.

### JUNIOR INFANTS – SECOND FORM

The first four years of Headfort's programme compliments the Irish Primary school curriculum with dynamic, handson lessons that focus on exploration and play. Core subjects including Maths, English and Irish form the backbone of the syllabus. Pupils also engage in weekly sessions of PE, Ukulele, Music, French, SESE and Positive Psychology. We prioritise character development though the innovative Virtues Programme.

Students can also avail of a number of extra-curricular activities including piano and guitar, drama and speech and drama. Our Infants classes are located in the imaginatively designed 'Forge' but pupils also get to enjoy the main school facilities such as eating in the main dining room and visiting their own dedicated library. This promotes the joy and love of reading that we encourage throughout the school.

#### 3rd FORM - S1

From 3rd Form upwards we continue to cultivate a love of learning. In these classes the Irish Primary School Curriculum broadens to include a subject-led approach. As a private prep school we have the flexibility and scope to expand the pupils' learning and experiences through classes such as Science, Spanish, French, English, Mathematics, History, and Geography as well as through sports such as Rugby, Hockey, Cricket, and Athletics.



In Headfort School we implement different teaching approaches, draw on best teaching practices, international perspectives and our extensive extra curricular programme.

This Senior 1 class is not a repeat sixth class option, but instead models itself on a Transition Year programme. This year gives pupils the opportunity to mature, take on leadership roles, gain different experiences and opportunities, get to know new people, and learn how to work as part of a team on project work.

There is a greater emphasis on personal growth and the development of leadership, critical thinking skills and selfdirected learning. This experiential year offers pupils the time, space, and opportunity to step away from a highly structured environment to one where they can take greater responsibility for their own personal and academic learning.

#### **SENIOR 1**

#### **CURRICULUM**

Children study English, Maths, French or Spanish, History, Geography, Science (Chemistry, Physics and Biology are taught as standalone subjects on a termly basis utilising a fully equipped laboratory), Religious Studies, Music, Art & Design, Computing, Positive Psychology and a choice between Irish and Latin & Classics.



The school has specialist Art & Design rooms with a traditional studio and a Computer Design laboratory.

Headfort School has a very vibrant sports culture and team sport forms an integral part of each school day from 3rd Form upwards. We strongly believe in the benefits of participating in team sport, promoting teamwork, and a sense of community as well as obtaining the health benefits that go along with regular exercise.

The core sports played at Headfort are Rugby, Hockey, Athletics, Cricket, Basketball, Football and Softball or Rounders and matches are frequently played against other schools.


Each Form enjoys a weekly music lesson that is built into the curriculum and an elective choir option.




The landscape around Headfort provides an expansive 'playground', from the classical topiary at the front of the house to the 'forts' in the woods to the back, where children are encouraged to play and explore safely.

Headfort is also unique in its ability to offer horse riding as an extracurricular activity for all ability levels, with beautiful grounds for hacking, cross-country and a purpose-built outdoor manège.

Children are able to stable their ponies at school if they wish and the summer term plays host to an annual gymkhana where they are able to showcase their progress.



### **STRUCTURE OF SCHOOL DAY**

As well as the option to board, Headfort offers wrap-aroundcare for day pupils making it a flexible choice for parents. Our Junior Infants – 2nd Form begin their day at 8.30am and finish at 3.00 pm. An after-school facility is available on site until 5.45pm.

From 3rd Form upwards the school day runs from 8.30am until 6.00pm. This structure incorporates playtime, sports, extracurricular activities and prep time (homework). A breakfast club for pupils starts at 8.00am each day.





"We encourage a broad approach to learning: an allround education." An enormous emphasis is placed on the wellbeing of all pupils.

Form teachers monitor the individual progress of each child and our small size allows us to develop meaningful relationships with all of our pupils. Teachers and Matrons prioritise listening and are always available to offer help and support when required or needed.

There are several proactive initiatives implemented to support the social and emotional development of all our pupils. Our Character Values programme introduces an awareness and the language of key life values such as honesty, integrity and kindness.

The school also has a dedicated chef and offers a nutritionally-balanced menu for all our students from Junior Infants onwards.





Children may board from the age of 10 years old. We pride ourselves on our ability to seamlessly transition our pupils offering them a caring, fun environment. Our boarding community is an internationally diverse body with pupils from Ireland, UK, Spain, France, USA, and China.

Flexi (maximum 2 nights a week) and 'sleep-overs' for day pupils are welcomed. We have a team of dedicated matrons and houseparents who create a home-from-home atmosphere for our pupils, organising nightly activities such as table quizzes, games nights, as well as end of term parties.

Befitting our close and small community, there is a longstanding tradition of boarders being frequently welcomed home by their friends at weekends.
